"Got Caught" Tickets

Students will be recognized for demonstrating our school values to create community, collaborate, and cultivate learning. When a staff member "catches" a student exemplifying one of these values, they can earn a "got caught" ticket.

"Got caught" tickets can be earned all over the school including in the classroom, on the playground, in the lunchroom, or in the hallway.



Think Time

Step 1: Non-Verbal Reminder

Teacher will use eye contact or stand close and use redirection to indicate student needs to make a better behavior choice

Step 2: Precision Request

If misbehavior continues, the teacher will respectfully state the expected behavior

Step 3: Think Time

If misbehavior continues, the student will be asked to reflect on their behavior in a supervised location. The student will be invited to re-join their class after they have discussed the impact of their behavior and a plan for the future with their teacher.

If a student receives three Think Times in a week, the teacher will call home.

Step 4: Think Time with Principal

If a student continues the disruptive behavior or is unsafe in the classroom, they will be sent to the office. The student will create a plan with the principal before returning to class to resume learning and the principal will call home.

Recess Expectations

- We use respectful words
- We play with a variety of friends and try new games
- We use a Kelso's Choice if there is a small problem
- We stay safe and follow adult directions
- We freeze when the bell rings

Lunch Expectations

- Voice level –2
- We include others, especially those who look lonely
- We engage in meaningful conversations
- We take risks to try new foods and learn how food affects our learning
- We "leave no trace" by throwing our trash and food waste away

Library Expectations

- Voice Level –1 (whisper)
- We share about great books we've discovered and learn from others
- We read "just right" books and help others find books of interest
- We take risks to try new genres or authors
- We take care of our books and return them on time

Assembly Expectations

- Voice Level—0.
- We listen respectfully and clap to show appreciation
- We work together to write, design, and produce assemblies
- We take risks to stretch ourselves in front of an audience and support others in doing the same
